Dissertation - Settling for Less: How Organizations Shape the Experience of College Sexual Assault

Using triangulated qualitative methods, this dissertation explores how organizational responses to sexual violence shape survivors' ideologies about gender and law. Findings indicate that organizations can subtly control the trajectories of sexual assault complaints to ensure desirable (for the institution) outcomes and manage survivors' reactions to organizational inaction. More specifically, all actors—including administrators, perpetrators, and survivors—will come to blame survivors for institutional failures and, accordingly, reinforce the gender ideologies that are known to make sexual violence more likely to occur in the future.
